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HIGH POWER WORKING IN THE AFFAIRS OF MANKIND

However indifferent man becomes to the countless blessings bestowed upon him and his unwillingness to recognise the centrel over his affairs by a High Power, the Almighty God, there are moments in life that even great men of high repute and thinking feel obliged to acknowledge this fact and utter words of gratitude to Him.

Sir Winsten Churchill in his young age as a war correspondent in the South Africa Beer War, was once in a desperate effort to avoid being receptured by the enemies. In his book My Barly Life on page 290, he writes:

"I dreaded and detested more than words can express the prespect of being caught and dragged back to Preteria. I found no comfort in any of the philosophical ideas which some men parade in their hours of ease and strength and safety. They seemed only fair-weather friends. I realised with awful force that no exercize of my own feeble wit and strength would save me from my enemies, and that without the assistance of the High Power which interferes in the eternal sequence of causes and effects more often than we are always prone to admit, I could never succeed. I prayed long and earnestly for help and guidance. My prayer as it seems to me, was swiftly and wonderfully answered".

Nearly half a century later as Prime Minister of England delivering a speech before the American Congress, he stated "There is a purpose being worked out here below" implying the working of a High Power (Almighty God) in the affairs of mankind.

At the conclusion of the last world war during 1945, moved with emotion and the feeling of divine help in the difficult period of his life and that of the British nation, he resolved "That this House do now-give humble and reverent thanks

thanks to Almighty God for deliverance from German domination". Thus God was given official thanks and henour in Parliament for the victory at the end of the last world war. (Plain Truth)

The fact is that it is inherent in human nature to feel the existence of a Supreme Being. This feeling is created by God Almighty Himself and the Hely Quran bears witness to this in the fellowing verse:

"Soon will We show them our Signs in the horizons (of the world) and in their ewn selves until it becometh manifest unto them that He is the Truth" (Sura HAMIN - Verse 53)

That all affairs of man are under the full centrel of the Supreme Being is stated in the following verse of the Guran:

> "His is the kingdom of the heavens and the earth; and unto God (alone) are returned (all) affairs". (Sura Al-Hadid - Verse 5)

But man is impatient. When he is faced with a calamity, he often tends to grumble and doubt the existence of the High Power capable of solving his problems and restoring him to a status of happiness and tranquility.

The main reason for this weakness and drawback is that man does not realise that he has been sent to this world to acquire virtues to be nearer to Allah. And inorder to ascertain the standard of his virtues, God Almighty has established a system of tests in this world which determine his spiritual perfection or lack of it, as the case may be. On this subject the Hely Quran has this to say:

"Verily, we created man from a drop of mingled sperm, so that we test him; and so we made him hearing and seeing"

(Sura AL-DAHR- Verse 2)

Often these days we hear of countless miseries and

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disasters around the world. Accidents, famine, earthquakes, fire and epidemics take away numerous human lives. Some of us may wonder why such episodes often termed as 'Act of Ged' happen and whether the Supreme Being is not able enough to control them. Some of us may wonder why the injustice to the victims of those disasters.

we must remember that death on this earth is not the end of life. We die here to live another life which we call 'Life Here-after'. Every inconvenience in this insignificant life will be rewarded for in the life here-after. The treubles in this world are not lasting whereas the rewards from Almighty Allah in the life here-after are everlasting.
